# How Are We Doing? (A Seven-week Report)

Thank you for your generous donations to Hiram Christian Church!

As of mid-February, our weekly offerings stood at about 20% of budget—significantly ahead for 13% of the year.

We also received \$260 in new donations for pew Bibles and \$116 for local food bank support. Total Week of Compassion figures are not yet complete, but totaled \$145 in the first week of the current special offering period. We even sold the last of our 2022 maple syrup, just in time to await eagerly our new 2023 syrup sales.

Our budgeted expenses are running nearly as expected (although we did pay a large bill for furnace maintenance in early February).

We expect approval of our "final" 2023 budget at the Board meeting in March. Meanwhile, thank you again for your generosity, and let's continue to support our church through generous financial gifts.

The Sabbatical Team has been working in coordination with the Board and the Region to interview candidates for the interim minister position. They are thrilled to announce that Rev. Roger Osgood has been hired and will serve Hiram Christian Church during the sabbatical from mid-April to mid-August (exact dates will soon be announced).

Rev. Roger D. Osgood most recently served Heights Christian Church (Shaker Heights), where he led the congregation from 2006 until retiring in June of last year. He and his wife, Debbie, have two grown sons (Alex and Mark) and three grandsons (Liam and, twins, Owen and Max). Pastor Roger and Debbie now enjoy biking, traveling, gardening, and the theater full time!

Sabbatical: April 17 - August 13

Our sabbatical season will occur between April 17th and August 13th of this year. This will be a time of renewal that is to be edifying to the church and the clergy who serve. We have been planning this since the call of Rev. McCreight - budgeting and making arrangements for continued ministry within this season through the hiring of Rev. Roger Osgood.

During the sabbatical, Chris will be utilizing the time to learn a contemplative practice, explore worship services from a variety of congregations, read, and rest. Chris has signed up for a contemplative leadership program, a class from the Center for Action and Contemplation, and will also plan to take retreat at the Gethsemani Abbey in Kentucky. He also has plans to attend the worship services at neighboring Mosques, Synagogues, and Churches. This, along with a good portion of rest, will provide a renewing practice that will carry on after the sabbatical and bless him and the congregation in their shared ministry.

The Board has identified wonderful goals of strengthening the relationships within this congregation and plans to arrange a host of potlucks and barbecues that we may continue to welcome one another into the fabric of this community. 
## Everything Belongs book study and conversation groups:
