Reflection:

The capacity to be oneself and be content within one's beauty and 'imperfection,' is often at the heart of a grateful and faithful existence; the inability to be is often at the root of a great division and suffering. We see this within the story of Jacob and Esau. Jacob emerges from the birth canal with his hand clenched upon Esau's heel - a symbol of what would become of a life forever grasping for that which is within reach and understood as "superior." The result is a life divided that soon divides the family and then is passed on to the next generation.

In his work, *Not in God's Name*, Rabbi Jonathan Sacks dives into the story and elevates what is perhaps hidden within the conclusion of the narrative: that although Jacob stole Esau's blessing, Esau forgave him, Jacob returned the blessing to Esau, and then Jacob received the blessing that was for him all along. It was never the case that there was only one blessing to be given, just that there was only one that was desired. There is always a blessing that is particular to every one of God's beloved children - tailored to every gift and vulnerability; bestowed for grace and purpose. We may see and desire that of another, and perhaps we are somewhere on that path right now. But what is ever before us is the sense of, and reception of, and living of the blessing that is for each of us.

May you know and know so well,

That you are created in the image of God - exactly as you are.

That you are a beloved child of God - exactly as you are.

And that there is a particular blessing for you, that brings forth goodness and gift for you as you carry it, and for others as you share it.

Let us continue to encourage one another to be who God has created and calls us to be.

And know that Pastor and I are also prayerfully thinking about some of you, and may be reaching out to YOU! Adult elective is meeting before church, at 9:45. We are reading and discussing the book, Dancing in the Darkness. Join us in the Fireside room!


Spiritual Formation (cont.):
